WHAT IS PUBLIC HEALTH?

Public Health is defined as "the art and science of preventing disease, prolonging life and promoting health through the organized efforts of society" (Acheson, 1988; WHO).

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF A PUBLIC HEALTH PROFESSIONAL?

As a public health professional, you will be trained to perform one or more of the following tasks:

- Monitor, diagnose and investigate the health status of a community to identify potential problems.
- Inform, educate, and empower people about health issues.
- Mobilize community partnerships to identify and solve health problems.
- Develop policies and plans that support individual and community health efforts.
- Enforce laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety.
- Promote equitable access to health services.
- Evaluate effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of individual and population-based health services.
- Develop research for new insights and innovative solutions to health problems.

WHERE CAN YOU WORK WITH A MASTER IN PUBLIC HEALTH (MPH)?

A public health degree opens the door to work in diverse settings such as:

- State and local health departments or agencies
- Nonprofits and community organizations
- Health care organizations and hospitals
- Private sector companies, such as health insurances and pharmaceutical companies
- Colleges and universities

HOW TO APPLY?

Deadline to submit a complete application is July 15. Financial aid available for qualified students.

APPLICANT MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING ADMISSION CRITERIA:

- Have a Bachelor's degree from a university or college licensed and accredited by corresponding agencies, with a minimum GPA of 2.50.
- Fluency in Spanish and ability to read and understand English.

SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS:

- Application fee of \$100.00, non-refundable.
- Official transcript from all undergraduate and graduate institutions attended (must be sent directly from the institution of origin).
- Two letters of recommendation that address the applicant development and performance at the academic and/or professional level and/or research experience and/or community service.*
- Certificate of Good Standing (Certificado de Antecedentes Penales-Negativo)
- Personal statement or essay explaining interest in studying an MPH degree.*
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume

CURRICULAR SEQUENCE

THE ONLY MPH PROGRAM IN PUERTO RICO TO OFFER IN PERSON (20%) AND DISTANCE (80%) EVENING COURSES.

The SJBSM Master of Public Health is a two year evening program consisting of 58 credits hours distributed in six (6) quarters and a summer session. The program has a total of 21 courses, of which seventeen (17) are offered through a synchronous distance education modality and four (4) in a face-to-face modality. Courses are offered Monday through Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
