This is a Doctor Degree in Nursing Practice with an specialty in Primary Care Adult Gerontology Nurse Practitioner is a 3 year evening program consisting of 78 credits hours distributed in 7 semester and 9 semester for part time students.

The program has 23 courses, of 12 courses face to face and 11 are offer synchronous distance education modality to prepare students to be Primary Care Providers for Adult Gerontology Population.

The students will develop skills for diagnosis, establishment the treatment plan, pharmacology and none pharmacology prescription. The program is focused in prevention and promotion and maintenance of a good health.

Also, the Studying Program trains its students to be leaders in nursing and promotes evidence-based research.

The program will be offering during evening, from 4:00 pm - 10:00 pm Monday to Thursday.
